### Meeting Call to order

Meeting was called to order at 5:31 pm by President Rob Philp. **Roll Call** Rob asked Bob to call the roll. At the time of roll call 12/20 were in attendance (included proxies). Tom Pickett joined ~ 5:40

## **Approval of the Minutes**

Minutes of 2024-06-17 Board Meeting were pending approval. Rob referenced copies Bob sent out for review on 2024-10-17.

Sassan moved minutes be approved for 2024-06-17 be approved, Dave seconded. Motion passed.

### **President's Message**

**Rob Philp** 

Rob welcomed the group. He briefly mentioned Fang Wang and Mary Gilliam resignations and noted for family and job reasons Martin had relocated back to Germany and his resignation was expected. Rob has a numerous conversations with people about stepping int o President Elect role (to replace Fang) and Second VP role to replace Mary. No one has agreed to step up yet. If you are interested or know of anyone we should be inviting, please let Rob know.

Based on the two year officer terms approved by second vote on 2023-12-18 (vote was e-vote from 12-4 to 12-18). Bylaws committee has not completed the bylaws revision based on the term change and reduction of total number of officers and committee realignment is may be a part of the changes coming.

Rob also said he would be bring up AutoEPCON 2025 for discussion in New Business. Dave Okonski has resigned as co-chair of AutoEPCON and no replacement co-chair has been identified.

Treasurer's Report

Dave reviewed his summary report, Performance to Budget 7-1-24 to 10-21-24 and the Check Registry for 8-21-24 thru 10-21-24.

The Detroit Section is presently financially solvent with a checking account balance of \$179,594.39 and an investment portfolio having a market value of about \$3.6M.

For the two-month period 8/21/2024 to 10/21/2024, expenses exceeded income by \$63,823.02.

Items of Interest:

- 1) Taxes are near completion. Dave thanked Tom Powers for his help on taxes.
- 2) Fraudulent activity regarding check # 1205,
  - a. Check # 1205 was originally issued on 5/11/2021 for \$50 to Lundyn Lewis (Scholarship Award).
  - b. Check # 1205 cashed by Lundyn Lewis on 8/19/2024 (Chase Bank).
  - c. Check # 1205 cashed on 9/3/204 for \$9,450 by ESC 3 Group (Chase Bank).
  - d. Fraud reported to 5/3 Bank on 9/4/2024.
  - e. Troy Police report filed on 9/6/2024.
  - f. \$9,450 returned to Detroit Section on 9/18/2024. Troy Police are no longer investigating as Chase Bank does not wish to pursue.
     Dave said he is not going to close account due to expenses replacing checks and he

thinks situation is under control. Dave also personally checks checking account daily for fraudulent activity. Rob told Dave if there is a reason in the future, that the expense is approved.

- 3) Still trying to get reimbursed (\$22,300) from the DOE for the Auto EPCON DOE Workshop
  - a. Payment actually coming through ORNL
  - b. Applied for a Unique Entity Number (UEI) SRLWL7J8JJN3
  - c. Applying for a CAGE Number still in process.

Dave reported that a large part of the problem is that we have not been using a consistent name for the section or using the name on our incorporation papers " **Detroit Section of the Society of Plastics Engineers"** and we should make sure we are using it in all cases including minutes of this meeting. Dave's reports are below.

Sassan moved Treasurer's report be approved, Keith seconded, **motion was approved.** After discussion about name, and assuring we use it consistently everywhere (invoices, minutes, announcements, etc.) Sassan moved we use formal name "**Detroit Section of the Society of Plastics Engineers**" and not do any name change. Keith seconded. **Motion was approved.** 

**Next section of agenda typically is led by President Elect.** Rob pointed out we still do not have a President Elect of Second VP after Fang and Mary resigned. Neil noted we have not had a Bylaws Committee meeting since May, reduction of number of officers was part of that discussion. Sassan noted we don't want to turn officer progression into a 10 year process. Bylaws Committee meeting will be scheduled by Rob.

Rob proceeded with agenda.

Preliminary results \$112,102.09 profit. Costs were much higher as anticipated at \$280,240.08 but lower than the \$325,000 budget.

Feedback on Tuesday start (due to Monday Night Football conflict caused by Marriott contract with NFL SPE moved date – still working on compensation from Marriott for that change.)

There we no "virtual only" registrations but significantly more in person registrations than target.

### Annual Toy Program (Nov./Dec. 2024)

Dawn finally got call back from American Plastics Toys and they are not interested this year but would like to talk about next year. Rob asked for followup information. Neil pointed out that it is too late for this year, but we need to work on a plan B, C.

Dawn explained that she feels dynamics have changed overall, especially with APT's new ownership. In the past they donated labor, utilities, assembly labor and machine time for approximately three weeks. If we are to continue the program, we should probably plan to spend some money. Neil added his support for her analysis and need for discussion. Bernd suggested we try to combine some efforts with PlastiVan<sup>®</sup>, Neil noted that would be with SPE Foundation. Bob said we could contribute to ESD's Christmas program, besides toys, since they donate to an orphanage and woman's shelter, they have needs for more than toys as well, things like tooth brushes (which are made of plastic) are something they always needed. We'll talk more off line.
