Approval of the Minutes

Shelby charter township, MI 48316 as Pine Trace is being refurbished and is out of service until next year. Cheery Creek is affiliated with Pine Trace. Dawn has contract for review. They are reducing minimum (was 144) and giving a discounted rate so she expects cost to be roughly half of what it was last year. Pricing will be out as soon as contract is complete. Treasurer's Report

Dave presented report, and reviewed Performance to Budget for the time 7/1/2024 to 4/20/2025 and the Check Registry for the time 2/17/2025 to 4/20/2025.

The Detroit Section is presently financially solvent with a checking account balance of \$97,371.32 and an investment portfolio having a market value of about \$3.36M.

- 1) A Purchase Order (\$22,300) has been issued by ORNL for the DOE Workshop that was co-located with the 2024 Auto EPCON Conference check not received yet.
- 2) All sponsorship monies for the Sustainability World Congress have been returned.
- 3) Since February 17th, our investment portfolio is down \$291,000.

 Dave noted that all money from Sustainability Conference (now postponed to 2026) had been returned.

Bob moved Treasurer's Report be approved as presented. Neil seconded. **Motion passed.**

Sustainability Conference

Sassan Tarahomi

Sassan reported that Sustainability Conference was postponed to June 9-11, 2026.

it was decided to postpone the conference by one year to give us adequate time to sign-up sponsors. Three sponsors had been signed and paid. Sassan was working on a major sponsor ship program with 4 divisions of Ravago, but details and total were taking too long. And other sponsorships were coming slowly.

One deposit of \$12,500 was paid to Huntington Place, the next will be due May 2026. They are increasing space to 200,000 sq ft (was 140,000)

Postponement letters went out March 24 to Sponsors, Keynote Speakers and Technical Speakers. Some of the student presentations given at EAV were a "dry run" for the Sustainability Conference. Sassan is working with Keith Young and students to come to Sustainability Conference next year. At this time have six keynotes locked in and may have as many as nine.

General admission tickets to be \$25. Presentation access tickets \$950. Working on a plan with Pat Farrey to do a discounted SPE membership program with presentation access tickets.

No hotel deals worked out yet, but hotels are normally used by sponsors so there is time for that. Neil asked Sassan to send any possible sponsors that fit TPO program to TPO (since Sassan s TPO sponsorship chair, he'll be doing this automatically)

OPTEC meetings have been cut back to monthly, first Monday of every month. Sponsorship Meetings are twice per month - first and third Friday of the month. If you want to be included, let Karen know and she'll put you and the invitation list.

Rohan Repale asked for more details on sponsorships.

Membership/Next Gen

Laura had no real data from last year for comparison. Snapshot of membership showed 3 Distinguished Members, 64 Emeritus, 13 Premium, 360 Professional, 72 student, and 116 Young Professional for a total of 628. Laura displayed new member numbers since January 2024, total for 2024 was 67, January 2025 was 13. Chris pointed out SPE has been purging expired members from roles sooner than they had in the past so numbers may not compare well to past years. June 2023 report showed 642 total members so little change.

Sassan asked "where Lifetime members were?" Laura said SPE did not have a Lifetime category. Norm and Chris said Lifetime was not an SPE category, HSM and Fellows had dues waived. Laura is planning on checking to assure all board members are up to date for insurance purposes.

IntersocietyBob Petrach

Bob had sent out his report with minutes for review. He highlighted Michigan Future Cities Competition January 21, 2025 and thanked volunteer judges Neil Fuenmayor, Tom Miller, Rachel Petrach, and Armando Sardanopoli who determined the winner of Incorporation of Plastics Materials Award - Joseph K. Lumsden Bahwetig Anishnabe Academy, Sault Ste. Marie – Fukuoka Team who chose to float their island city using hollow plastic spheres.

As in year's past there was little knowledge of plastic materials and general feelings were negative. **But did notice an opportunity.** Teams are only allowed 3 presenters, however, most teams are much larger. Those students are in another room with a variety of learning activities. This would be a great opportunity to have a running PlastiVan® class open to all. Bob will follow up with ESD, then Tom Miller and Mark Richardson as needed.

Old Business/ New Business

Rob asked is there was any more old or new business to discuss today.

Old Neil asked if AutoEPCON was dropped for 2025. Rob confirmed it was.

New ANTEC Neil plans on attending, so does Dave. Neil Rob, Tom Miller and Dave will get together to plan coverage of Leadership, and Councilor's meeting and also give time for ANTEC presentations. Both Rob and Tom are unable to attend. Tom may be able to assign Councilor proxy to Dave or Neil.

Rob is planning on taking on the newsletter responsibility, Jitesh volunteered to help Rob on newsletter.

Sassan noted need to get bylaws updated and asked who was on committee. Committee is set as Rob, Neil, Dave, Bob and Sassan.

Neil asked about a possible reschedule of EvosNA Tech meeting/ tour. Rob will ask Bernd about it. Question highlights the need for a Programs Chair.

Rob thanked everyone for attending and noted jobs needing to be filled and open board positions and asked that if you know of anyone interested in serving put them in touch with Rob.

Sassan moved meeting be adjourned, Neil seconded, Motion passed, adjourned at 7:25 pm.
